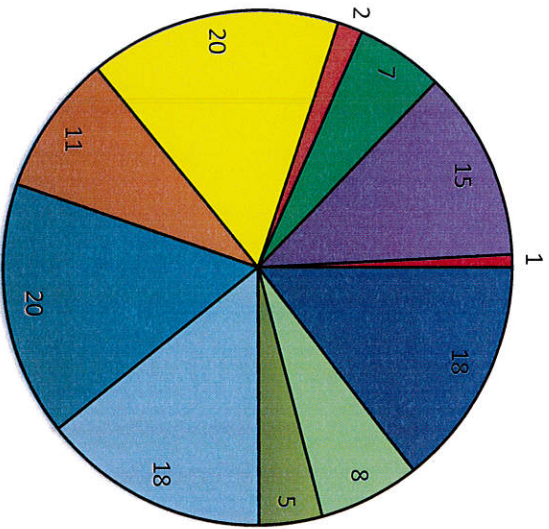

As of December 31, 2018 the County Code Administrator's office has issued a total of 125 construction permits for a total of \$20,674.36*. Table 1 indicates the total fees collected for each Township and table 2 provides a breakdown of the type of structures that we permitted for. Other income received was \$7,385.70 for a total income of **\$28,060.06**. The estimated value of the new construction for 2018 is **\$4,445,776**. In addition the office returned to the General Fund over \$8,733.00 from the annual budget. Included in the total are 12 agricultural permits issued with \$1,030.40 in fees were waived. In addition, the office also received \$33,000.00 in grant funds from IHDA. The office has also made application for an additional \$33,000.00 in grant funding for the Hazard Mitigation Plan, and \$25,000.00 in additional grant funding from IHDA.

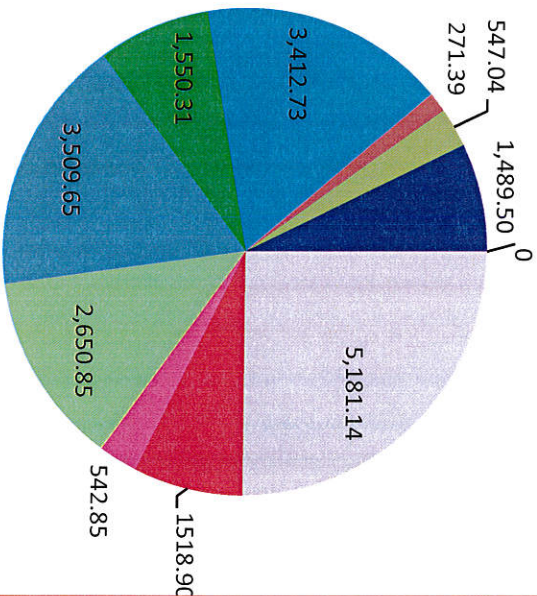
Illustration of Fees by Township

Fees Collected By Township

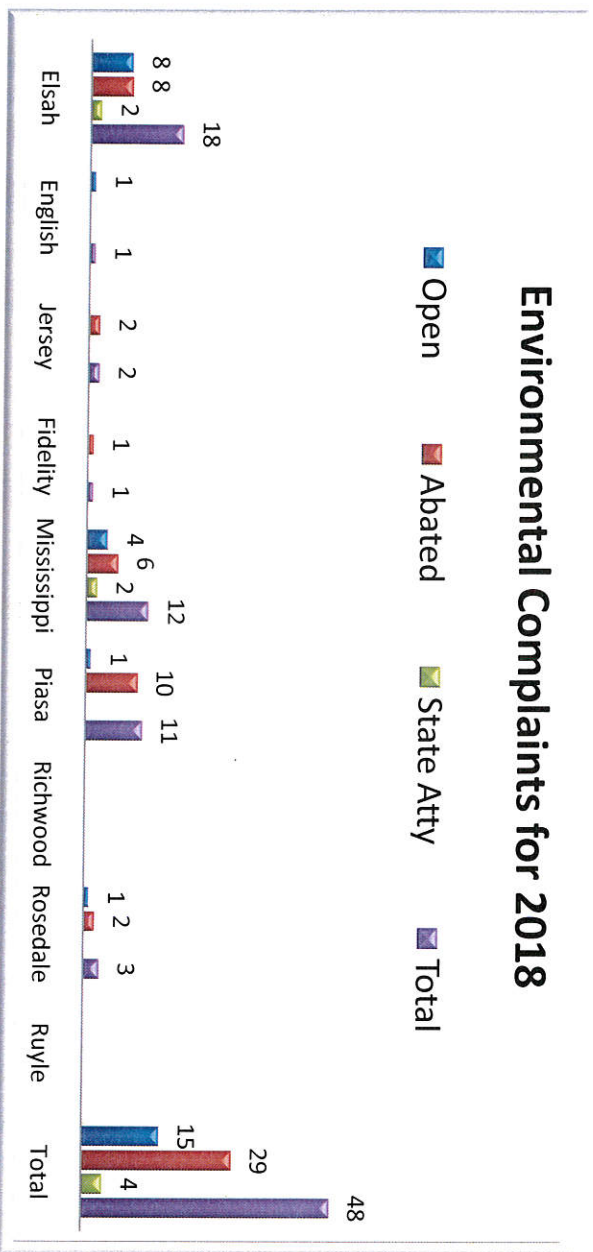

The 2018 Environmental Complaint Report Jersey County Code Administrator

The office receives numerous environmental complaints from residents all through the year. Most of these property issues are remedied through the adopted Property Maintenance Ordinance while others are rejected. The figures reported are justified complaints.

The majority of the complaints consisted of derelict vehicles, abandoned or dilapidated houses, tires, and tall grass and weeds. The following chart illustrates the Townships that we have received complaints for 2018.



There were a total of 48 complaints, 29 complaints were abated, 15 are still open and of these 48 cases, 4 citations were issued and are in court proceedings. The bulk of the complaints are located in the townships of Elсах and Mississippi followed by Piаса.
